## **Athletics**

# Principal's Report

#### School-Wide

- There is now a group of students that have formed the Islamic Excellence. They work with Mr. Hassan and Ms. Jivraj and they meet every other week. It's been especially important during Ramadan to celebrate and acknowledge important dates.
- There will be a school wide Culture Day on April 27th. There will be a door decorating contest but since we're not allowed to have any flammable substance on the doors, it will be an "around the door" decorating contest

# **Planning**

- Heavily involved in the planning for the 2023-2024 school year. Summerside is growing and will be adding one
  more class. Projected enrollment at 589 students. Currently sending requests for EA's and working on
  tentative assignments for teachers and ECE's. We will be hiring more staff.
- Once teaching assignments are finished, then we'll be looking at time tables and class lists. We'll be sending a message to parents giving them the option to give us feedback for their child's placement next year.
- There's a big focus on literacy word recognition, phonics, decoding. The old program, balanced literacy, was leaving kids behind in literacy. A lot of staff at Summerside have taken Top 10 Tools For Literacy focus on phonics but also comprehension. We also offer remediation for students struggling through tiered interventions. The goal is for every student who comes into our school to be able to read.

## **Budget**

- The board budget for furniture and supplies has a little over \$3,000 left. There is an ability to shift money back into that
- We've also received special grants, \$2000 for outdoor education and \$2700 for our Specialized Program classes
- The poet that is visiting was paid for with student success funds, we asked for \$5000 and received \$300. We also used some of that money for the Grade 8s to go to Sir Wil on a school bus
- Consumables budget of \$5176 was almost completely spent on paper, pencils, duotangs
- We received funding for art supplies and have spent the whole \$2000
- Funding for music was mostly spent to repair/replace instruments this was how we got ukuleles. The cost to repair band instruments this year was \$2500
- School generated funds budget which is raised by popcorn, hot dog days there's about \$3000 left and it's used to subsidize field trips
- There is the long-term school generated fund which holds \$20398.75 will be putting this towards outdoor classroom
- \$5034 has been given to school for curtains, lights working on obtaining quotes now
- Grade 8s are planning a graduation trip to Montreal. The cost of the trip is \$4700 and there's approximately \$1100 set aside

# **Treasurer's Report**

After depositing our Pizza Term 2 cheques and the \$1253 that we thought we would lose to school cash online fees, the current account balance is \$38,036.94.

# Spending

## Grad

 It's voted on and agreed that School Council will put \$1000 aside for the grad committee to spend as they see fit but that it should cover a portion of the grad trip, outdoor grad sign, and possibly refreshments for the leaving ceremony

## **Outdoor Classroom**

 It's voted on and agreed that School Council will fund the remaining balance of \$19,000 to build a new outdoor classroom with the inclusion of a stage. Construction is believed to begin this summer with Summerside being able to begin using the outdoor classroom as soon as next fall

# **Community Donations**

• It's agreed that School Council will move forward with \$1000 donations each to Carson Grove E.S and the Education Foundation of Ottawa

• It's agreed that the staff wishlist will be put on hold and funded after completion of collection Term 1 pizza sales in or around October of 2023
